<p><u>Languages homework rationale</u></p>	<p>Quizlet: KS3 & 4: pupils have access to a classroom on Quizlet. Quizlet quizzes are written by their teachers and are aligned to the vocabulary met in class. The vocabulary is learnt in chunks to get the most out of working memory and to tie in with the department’s lexico-grammatical approach of teaching language in useful phrases as opposed to one word items of vocab. The pupils consolidate their learning via the flashcard function and decide which vocab they know and do not know (metacognition). They then (retrieval practice) practise the lesser secure vocab more often. Other consolidation Quizlet activities are ‘match/quiz/test. Quizlet allows for spaced retrieval as sets can be combined together – so for example learning from week 2 in autumn 1 with current Spring week 3. The teacher can track the learners use of Quizlet as it has a set of diagnostics for each set set as hwk. The same set set a class is then used as retrieval practice as starters.</p> <p>KS4: listening/reading: To widen the exposure to listenings, it is department-wide practice to set a listening and a reading/translation activity from the AQA workbook series. The questions are often set out in an exam style. Homework is handed in once a week and the answers are marked in class.</p> <p>Reading is an area where we are ‘apprenticing’ our learners to think like a linguist i.e. disciplinary thinking as pupils need explicit training and then application of technique of how to deal with a text that contains unfamiliar vocabulary. The reading homework offer this extra practice.</p>
