<b>Subject Homework Rationale</b>	<p><b>KS4 – Health &amp; Social Care</b>  <b>Coursework Units – Coursework</b> - students will be set regular weekly/fortnightly homework dependent upon the unit to complete outstanding coursework that they have not finished in lesson time, this is crucial to ensure students remain on track with the unit so it can be submitted for moderation. In between coursework assignments students may be set <b>Cultural Capital</b> homework tasks such as researching current affairs and/or careers in Health and Social Care.  <b>Exam Units</b> – Students will be set regular <b>low stakes quiz</b> homework tasks to help embed learning and improve recall of key knowledge. Students may also be set <b>practice</b> exam questions to help further enhance their exam technique and get students used to the exam paper structure.</p>					
	<p><b>KS5 – Health &amp; Social Care:</b>  <b>Coursework Units</b> – Students will be set weekly homework tasks to ensure they stay on top of coursework assignments. They may also be set cultural capital independent research tasks to help enhance they quality of their coursework. It is crucial students keep on top of coursework to ensure they complete the unit in time for moderation.  <b>Exam Units</b> - Students will be set a range of homework tasks to help prepare them for the their exams. This will be a mixture of <b>low stakes quizzes</b> to help improve retrieval of key knowledge. <b>Cultural capital</b> research tasks to help enhance understanding of the subject context. <b>Flipped learning</b> research tasks to give students exposure to difficult content before the lesson to help reduce cognitive overload. <b>Practice</b> - exam questions to give a greater understanding of the exam structure and what the mark schemes are looking for.</p>
