Promoting reading:

World Book Day 2023 Activities	Completed
<p>Book Review: Choose a book you have read recently and write a book review (this could be one from your English Literature lessons). You can discuss the plot, characters, themes, and writing style of the book, and share your opinions on whether you enjoyed it or not and why.</p>	
<p>Book Character Analysis: Choose a character from a book you've read and analyse that character's motivations, personality, and actions. Explore how the character contributes to the overall theme of the book.</p>	
<p>Literary Analysis: Find a short story or poem and analyse its literary elements, such as symbolism, metaphor, and imagery. Discuss how these elements contribute to the meaning of the text.</p>	
<p>Book Trailer: Create a book trailer for a book you've read. You could draw this or use video editing software to create a short video that captures the mood and themes of the book and encourages others to read it.</p>	
<p>Book Cover Design: Design a book cover for a book you've read. You could use graphic design software or create a physical design using any crafts around your home. Consider the themes and motifs of the book when creating your design.</p>	
<p>Author Research: Research an author you admire and create a presentation on their life, works, and themes. You could include quotes, images, and video clips to help illustrate your points.</p>
